The information obtained was analyzed using Epidemiological tools (Epi Info) to identifying public health needs of the population for the future development of an intervention project. The collection, management and organization of data were vital for obtaining accurate epidemiological information pertaining to households located within this community. This study provided information to the Belize Ministry of Health (MOH), the Belize National Emergency Management Organization (NEMO) and the University of Belize. The data collected will be beneficial for the target population as the exchange of knowledge facilitates the development of programs that will improve the overall quality of life for those in San Martin. Worked with students from the University of Belize in the development of the survey instrument and the study procedures for conducting a needs assessment for future research within Belize.
