BIOGRAPHY

Randall Kuhn is a demographer and sociologist focused on the social determinants of health among vulnerable populations. He is an expert in survey design, longitudinal analysis and counterfactual research design. In global health, Kuhn led a 35-year longitudinal study of the impact of health and development programs in Bangladesh and numerous cross-country evaluations. In immigrant health, Kuhn has designed new approaches to estimating the causal effects of migration on health. In the study of homelessness, Kuhn has used administrative data and mobile phone surveys to pioneer longitudinal studies of homeless trajectories and health across the life course.
