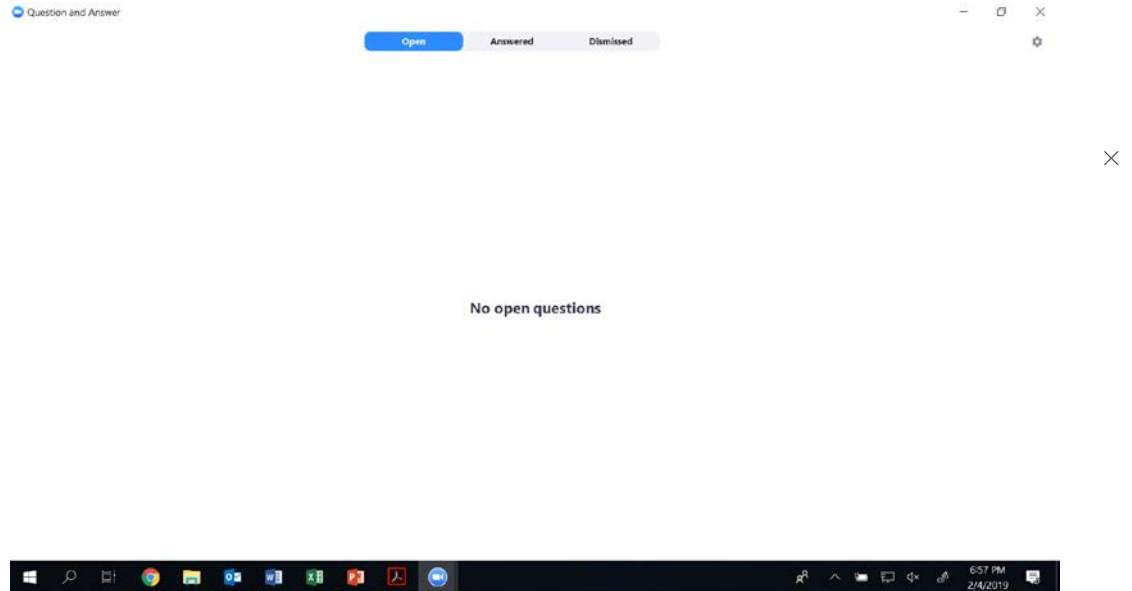

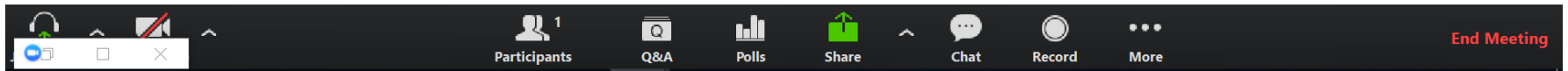

# **Communication for Community Resilience: Landslide Guide for Residents of Puerto Rico**

**Tuesday, June 9, 2020  
1:00 to 2:00 p.m. Eastern**

Hurricane Maria triggered 70,000 landslides across Puerto Rico when it struck the island in 2017. The far-reaching impacts of this event prompted calls for scientific information, mitigation assistance, and risk communication guidance. A team from the U.S. Geological Survey, the University of Puerto Rico Mayagüez, and the Natural Hazards Center responded with the recently released [\*Landslide Guide for Residents of Puerto Rico\*](#), a risk communication tool designed particularly for Puerto Rico.

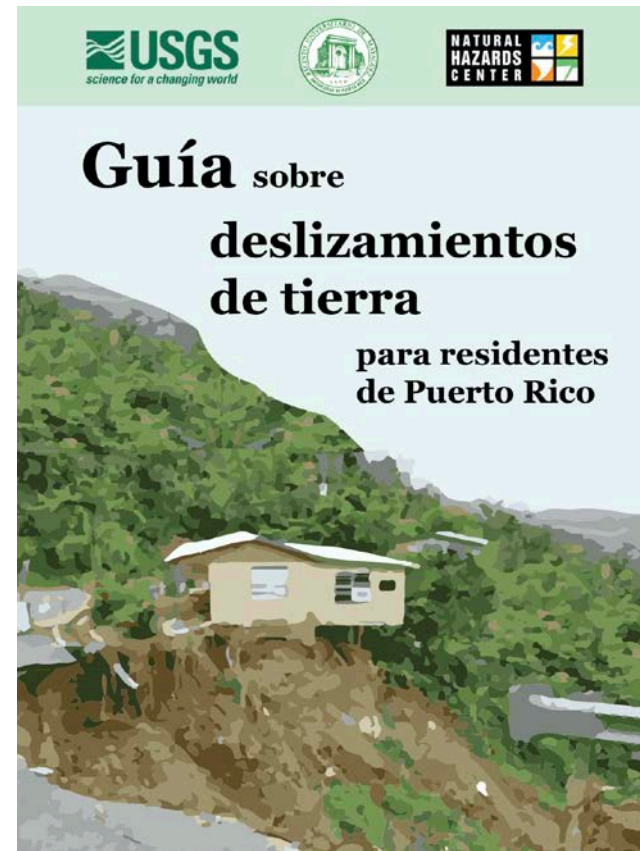
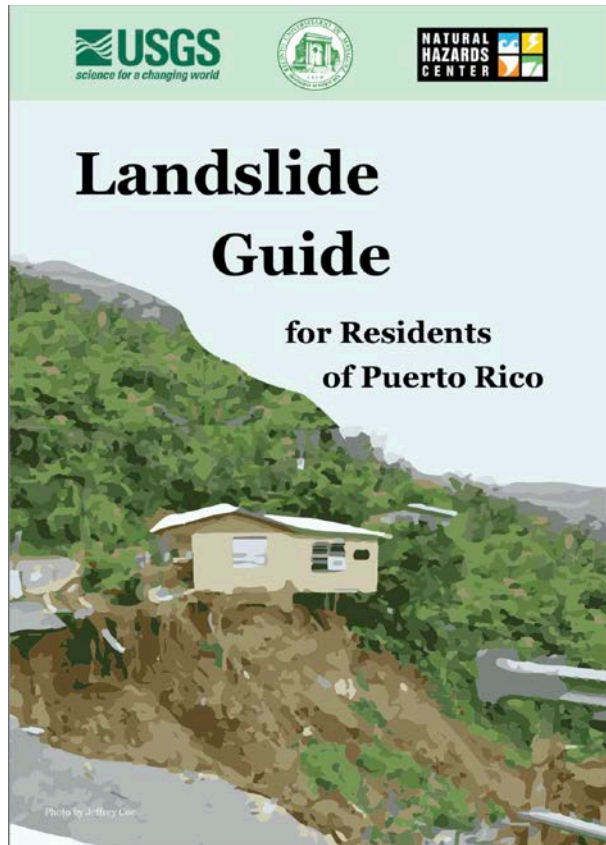
