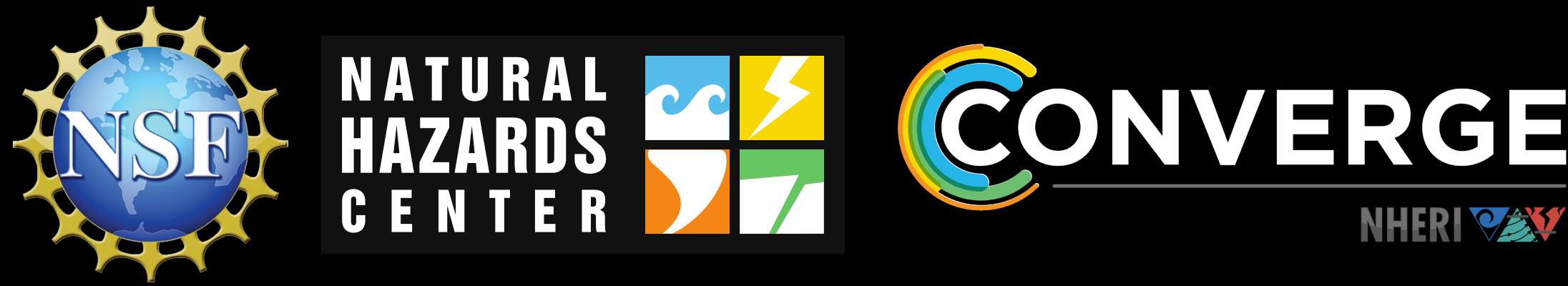

CONVERGE is committed to supporting ethical and rigorous convergence research that seeks to solve pressing social and environmental challenges.

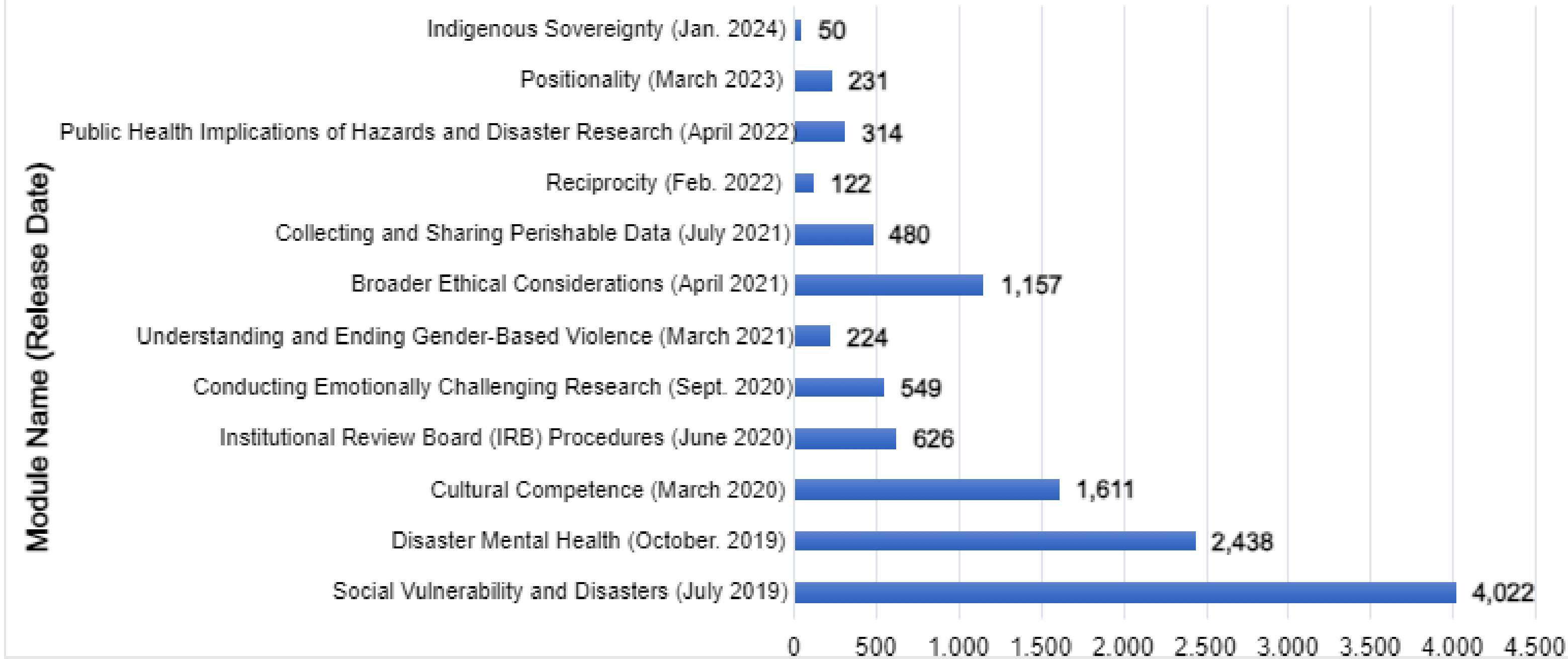
CONVERGE Training Modules

The CONVERGE Training Modules are free online courses designed to accelerate the education of hazards and disaster researchers and practitioners, with a special emphasis on students and early career professionals. Each module takes 30-60 minutes to complete and includes:

- Learning objectives;
- Written educational content;
- Case study vignettes;
- Suggestions for future research/practice;
- A list of resources for further review;
- An annotated bibliography;
- A final quiz and certificate of completion; and
- 1 contact hour of general management training through the International Association of Emergency Managers (IAEM) certification program.

of Completions by Module

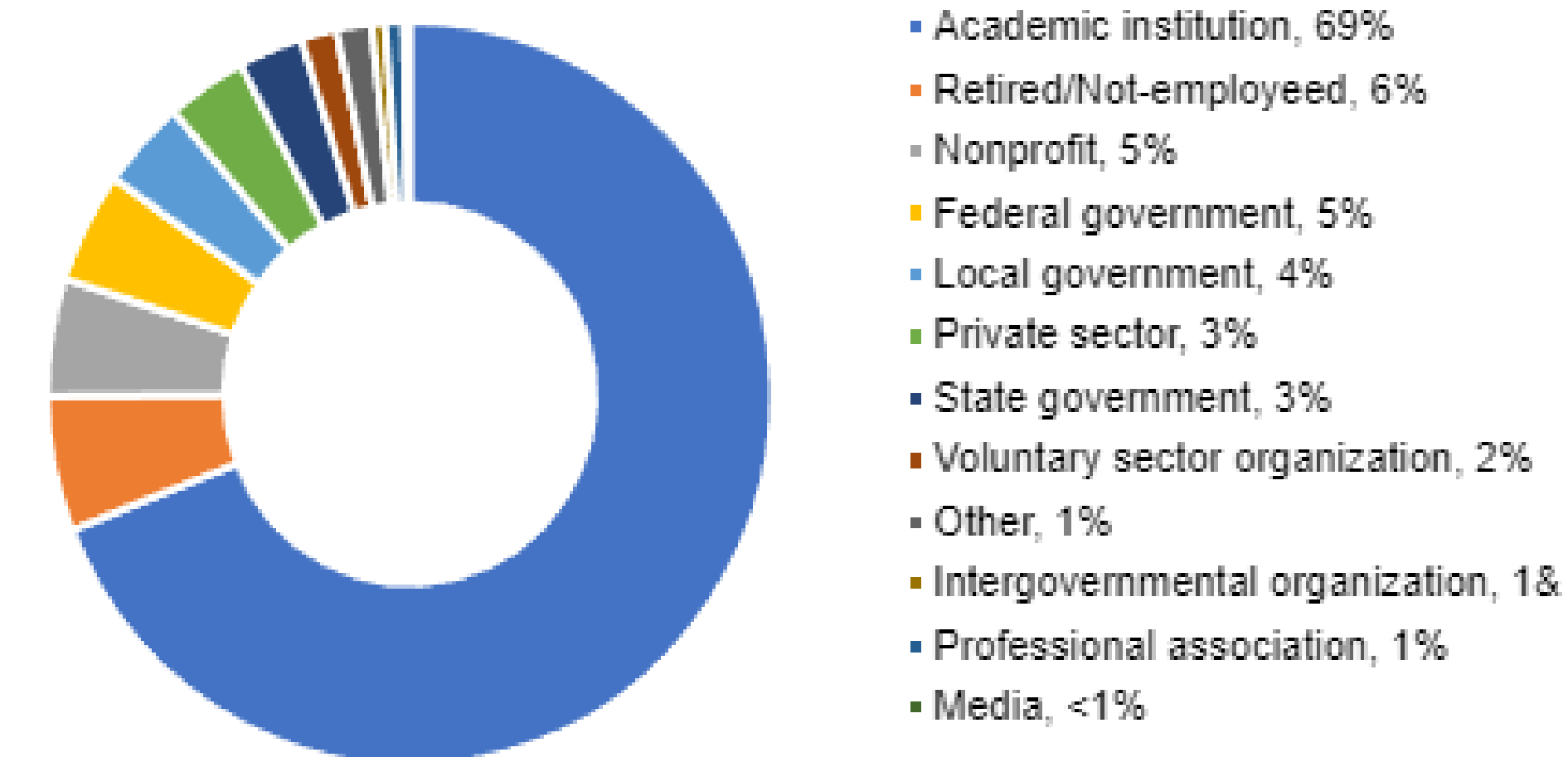

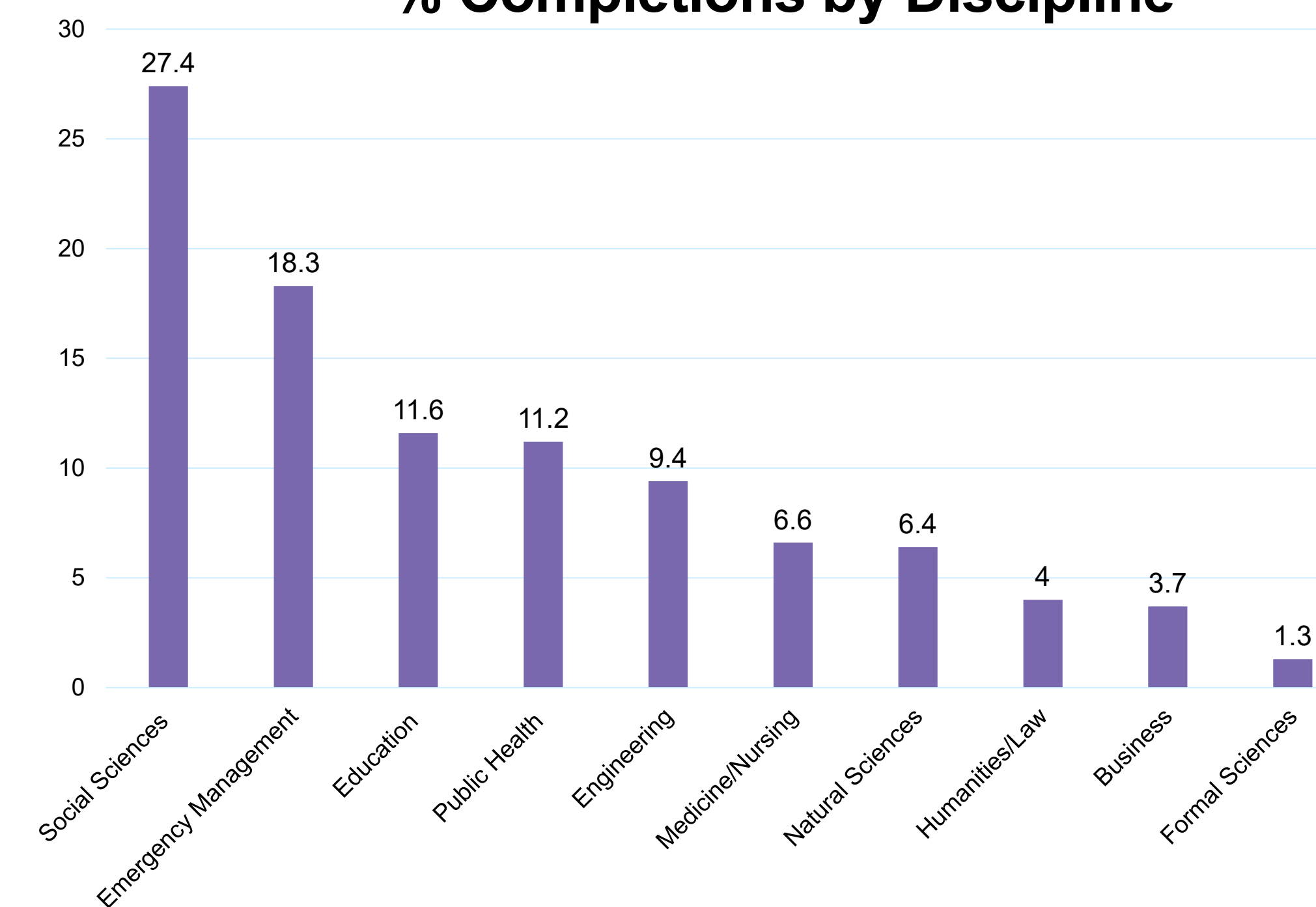
